

WHAT IS THE NORTHWEST LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP?

The Northwest Law Enforcement Academy Scholarship is awarded to a secondary school graduate in recognition of their academic and leadership accomplishments and the desire to pursue a career in law enforcement.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

Eligibility requirements are:

- Applicant must be 17 years of age at commencement of the Law, Protection and Safety Diploma Program.
- Applicant must be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant.
- Applicant will be graduating senior from Grade XII (Senior 4).
- Applicant must demonstrate outstanding qualities in the areas of leadership, community spirit, involvement in extra-curricular activities and a commitment to place the welfare of others above their own needs.
- Applicant must complete the application.

SCHOLARSHIP VALUE

The amount of the scholarship is determined by the number of candidates that are deemed as contenders for the scholarship. The number of scholarships awarded may vary from year to year.

SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. Applicant must have successfully completed NWLEA's applicant screening process and have a letter of acceptance to the Academy.
- 2. The NWLEA Selection Committee will consider the following for purposes of awarding scholarships:
 - Academic Achievement
 - Athleticism/Fitness
 - Community Service
 - School Attendance
 - Attitude and Aptitude (Character)
 - Leadership
 - Volunteer Work
 - Results of the Entrance Exam and Screening Interviews
 - Guidance Counsellor/Teacher Evaluation
- 3. Recipients will be announced at their high school graduation and will receive a letter from Northwest Law Enforcement Academy.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. You must successfully complete the Law, Protection and Safety Diploma Program to receive the credit for the scholarship.
- 2. The Scholarship credit will be applied towards the tuition of the Diploma Program.
- 3. If the recipient leaves the institution (either due to their own withdrawal or being released from the program) or does not successfully complete the Diploma Program, they are responsible for the full financial obligation of the program to the date of their withdrawal as per the Enrollment Contract that they signed with the Academy. They have voided the Scholarship Agreement and will receive no credit towards their tuition.
- 4. Adherence to the Academy's Rules and Regulations is mandatory in maintaining the scholarship. You must apply yourself to the program, maintain passing grades; and have not been subject to any disciplinary advisories.
- 5. If the recipient must delay their start date for any reason, the scholarship will be held up to one (1) year from their high school convocation date.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Applications will be disqualified if the following instructions are not followed:

Applicant's Portion:

- 1. Complete all information of the official scholarship application. (Application form may be photo copied.)
- 2. Type or print legibly all information on the application.
- 3. Write a one-page essay describing why you deserve a scholarship. Direct comments toward your motivation, need (financial or otherwise), leadership, and academic accomplishments. Describe special talents and special, creative or challenging activities that you have initiated or obstacles you have overcome to achieve your goals. Direct comments towards why you would like to pursue a career in law enforcement.

This essay must be **handwritten**, **single-spaced**, and **on one-side of one page**, with your name and school in a single line across the top of the page. Content, originality, and **form** (punctuation, spelling, and grammar) will be considered.

 Provide your application and essay, and a copy of your academic transcript to your guidance counsellor/teacher for dispatch to NWLEA. Make sure to sign your application before it is forwarded to Northwest Law Enforcement Academy.
